REVIEW: Read Acts 10:1-17 and 28-34 Was there anything from Sunday's message or your own reading of this chapter that you had questions about or would like to comment on?

1. Sunday Pastor Jim taught that the church is for everyone, but not everyone thinks so. What did you think about that statement?

2. In the story Peter, a Jewish man, had a cultural bent against Gentiles/non-Jewish people. And this was his barrier to reaching everyone and anyone for Christ. Being honest, what type of people would make you uncomfortable if they joined your life group and why? And what must you unlearn concerning those types of people?

3. Acts 10:13-16 Peter tells God "no." Is there anything currently God's word is telling to do or not to do but you are saying "no?" If you can share, then please share. And if you cannot, that is fine also.

4. Double Bonus Jeopardy question: How do Acts 10:13 and Mark 7:5, 14-20 fit together? And what does this teach us about how difficult it is to unlearn something?

5. To reach lost people always remember "Grace always offends." Now read Luke 19:1-7. Zaccheus is a hated tax collector considered unclean by the Jews. Jesus eats with him and remember the food was bought with money he basically robbed from the Jews. So some of the church folk begin to grumble in verse 7. When we as people or as a church decide to be Prodigal friendly there will be some who misunderstand and accuse us of being too liberal or even ignoring Bible standards...Grace always offends. Jesus was spotless and hung out with the spotted and that was risky. At this time in your life who would you be more like in the story, Jesus or the church grumblers? Why?
